



## Clare's Law

- Also known as the Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme.
- Clare's Law gives any member of the public the right to ask the police if their partner has a history of domestic violence or violent acts that may pose a risk to them.
- Under Clare's Law, a member of the public can also make enquiries into the partner of a close friend or family member.
- If you have concerns about your partner's background, you can apply for disclosure by going to the police.
- You can request information by going online.
- You can visit your local station in person, call 101 or speak to an officer on the street.
- If you or someone you know is being abused you can tell the police by calling 101 or by reporting the crime online.
- If there is an immediate risk to someone's safety please call 999.
